# Potters Bar Cricket Club – reigning champions



Not every sporting team in the town can make that claim, but Potters Bar Cricket Club certainly can. They won the Saracens Hertfordshire Premier League in 2022, following up their wins in 2019 and 2020. In addition, they have won the Herts T20 competition twice within that 4-year period.

The club has been active since 1862 and still plays on the same ground in The Walk. With Colts teams at U9, U10, U11, U13, U15 and U17 level, they are proud to have produced two county professionals in recent years.

Thilan Walallawita perhaps has the most interesting story. Born in Sri Lanka, he came to England having survived the Boxing Day Tsunami aged 8 and now holds British citizenship. A left arm spin bowler, he has played First Class Cricket for Middlesex and Panadura (Sri Lanka), and also plays for Potters Bar regularly when released. Leicestershire batter Rishi Patel is the other current professional playing for the side.

The club plays at the highest level of recreational cricket in this country which is open to them and regularly face current and ex-internationals players. Winning the Herts T20 competition gave entry to the national competition, where they lost by just 2 runs to eventual winners Hornchurch from the Essex Premier League. Three other elevens play within the Hertfordshire League. The 2nd XI play in Division 2B, the 3rd XI play in 6B and the 4th XI play in Division 10 East.

The first competitive 2023 home match will be a T20 against Hemel Hempstead on 29th April; the first home league match is on 6th May versus Hertford. They are still a young team, and as reigning champions will certainly be the side everyone will want to beat.

They pride themselves on being a welcoming family club. With matches throughout the summer, their town centre ground is an excellent place to enjoy a beer or two on a Saturday or Sunday afternoon in arguably the best back garden in the area.



# How did Potters Bar get its name?

The first record is in a document of 1385 which describes Potters Barr as a gate giving access to Enfield Chase and situated at the sharp bend in The Causeway outside the entrance to Morven. By 1754, Potters Barr had become the name of a group of about a dozen properties, including two inns, on the west side of what is now The High Street.

Members of a Local History Group in the Potters Bar branch of U3A studied this and other similar questions throughout the past year and the results of their work have now been published by the Potters Bar Historical Society. This book is proving extremely popular with over two hundred copies sold in the last three months. Every road in the town is mentioned and there are photographs illustrating many different house styles.

In parallel with this work, further research into what factors influenced the development of the town has resulted in the preparation of an *'Illustrated Talk'* comprising a series of maps and photographs. This too is proving very popular.

We work with young people from across London, Hertfordshire, and the Home Counties.

Imagine being a teenager, struggling with social anxieties or a learning disability, frustrated because school is too difficult, and you don't have many friends. You feel like you have nobody to talk to who will understand, and even if you did, you don't know how to talk about how you are feeling. It just seems easier to not attend school and disengage from society and those around you.



# Hook House Part 3 -The Oshwal Centre

The temple (Jain Deraser) known locally as the Oshwal Centre is located on the site of the old Hook Farm. The whole area comprises the Temple itself, which is quite small in stature, the offices being located in the original Hook Farmhouse, and there are also very large meeting halls capable of accommodating hundreds of people where weddings and other ceremonies are conducted.



The temple, which had to be built on virgin land, started construction in 1985 and is built of an attractive pink sandstone. Mostly carved and shipped from Ambaji in India, the interior of the building is in white marble. The

main symbol of the Jains is the Swastika, or Sathia, the arms of which show that people are born into one of four destinies; heavenly beings, human beings, animal beings (including plants) and hellish beings. The Jain religion is known to have existed since at least 3,000 years BC and is a peaceful non-violent religion. How ironic that their symbol was usurped in the 1930s and represented a far more sinister organisation. They are vegetarians, and followers regard Jainism as a way of life having respect for all creatures and plants.

# Why it's good to keep our hearts healthy

Some say that "absence makes the heart grow fonder", but we feel that "exercise makes the heart grow stronger". Those readers who have experience of heart-related issues will know only too well the *importance of staying fit and minimising the risk of* further heart problems. That is exactly how the Enfield "Heart Throbs Cardiac Exercise and Support Group" was formed in 1990.

We are a local, non-profit organisation, affiliated to The British Heart Foundation, with Community Amateur Sports Club (CASC) status, with connections to Chase Farm, Barnet and North Middlesex Hospitals. We have over 100 members, with most engaging in regular exercise and support classes. There is no contract or signing-on fee to join our group and our monthly fees for new members are between £25-£40, depending on how many classes you wish to attend.

Heart problems strike all age groups and affect people from all walks of life and all communities. Amazingly, around 1.4 million people alive in the UK today have survived a heart attack. As a result, many of our members can share real stories of medical experiences eg medications, stents and operations.

The impact of the pandemic in the last few years has taken a toll on the lifestyles of many in our community. We started "At Home" online classes via Zoom, with members having a chat before the sessions start and then following up on our own "WhatsApp" group for messaging, quips and jokes.

Each week, Heart Throbs currently offers 7 'live' exercise classes run at Holtwhites Sports and Social Club and St Stephen's Church Hall, both in Enfield, plus 2 'At Home' Zoom classes. All classes are safely supervised by suitably qualified instructors who encourage our diverse group of members to have a more active and happier lifestyle. We also hold monthly social evenings, including a range of relevant topics delivered by guest speakers, plus quiz nights, BBQs.

Whilst we are primarily a support group for people with heart problems, we are very welcoming to partners, family members and others in the wider local community who may be interested - as we believe that "Prevention is better than Cure".



17 year old local paperboy, Hugo, is achieving international diving recognition specialising at the 3 metre level. Hugo started diving aged 8 and now trains with Dive London at the London Aquatic Centre in Stratford, enabling him to train alongside some of the best athletes in the world. Hugo currently dives 6–7 days a week for 20+ hours in the pool and the dryland facility.

Lockdown presented a real challenge with Hugo prevented from representing GB for the first time in Geneva, the '8 Nations Youth Diving Meet' being cancelled.

Competitions started again in 2021 and in May Hugo took part in his first senior event, 'Fina's Diving Grand Prix 2021' winning a Bronze in the 3 metre Men's Springboard event and a Silver in the Men's 3m springboard synchro event. Hugo finally made his international debut in June 2021 when he represented GB in Croatia at the 'European Junior Diving Championships 2021' coming 5th on the 3 metre springboard.

In October 2021, Hugo competed in the 'British Elite Junior Diving Championships' in Plymouth taking Gold on Platform in Synchro, Gold on 3 metre in synchro and Gold on 3 metre individual, setting a new British record! Further success was achieved in April 2022 at the British Elite Junior Diving Championships. Hugo had another gold medal on 3 metre Springboard bronze on 1m Springboard and Gold on 3m synchro. There was further international success in 2022 at 'Futures Cup 2022' and the European Junior Diving Championships in Otopeni, Romania.

Hugo was selected to represent GB in Montreal, Canada in December at the 'FINA World Junior Diving Championships 2022', a huge achievement as this event is only held every 2 years and the world's best junior divers come together to compete. Hugo won a bronze in the 3metre synchro.

Continued progress could mean selection for GB at the Paris Olympics.



## Potters Bar Allotments a hundred years of growing -from A-Z

There have been allotments on or near the current site off Highview Gardens since 1895. The site is owned by Hertsmere Borough Council, fulfilling its duty under the Allotments Acts for local councils to provide allotments in their areas if there is a demand. And that has certainly remained the case in recent years with long waiting lists for plots.

The site is run by Potters Bar Allotments Association and, as we are volunteers, costs are low which is reflected in the rents that the 120+ plot holders pay.

You may have a picture in your mind of the 'typical' allotment holder and what they grow. Early 20th century council minutes record that the allotment holders of the time were "railwaymen, policemen and civilians". We still have people from these groups, but they are now part of a wider range of occupations and heritage – from accountants to vets, and Albanians to Zimbabweans. There are many female members now; in fact, the majority of the committee is female.

The diversity of the membership is reflected in what they grow – literally from A–Z if you call your courgettes 'zucchini'! All that is required is that the plots are used primarily to grow vegetables and are well-tended. The benefits to physical and mental wellbeing of being in the fresh air, growing produce for you, your family and friends to eat are well documented. Last year's record-breaking temperatures resulted in bumper crops of tomatoes, courgettes, pumpkins and squashes – even melons.

There is almost always a waiting list for plots, so the earlier you contact us the better, if you are thinking about taking a plot on. Anyone interested should contact **allie.pbaa@outlook.com** for further information and to visit the site.


