


Mount Grace, the mixed comprehensive school serving the local community in the centre of Potters Bar, is currently looking for people to volunteer as governors at our school.


He has now become the fastest to complete the London Marathon dressed as a brain with the run coinciding with Stress Awareness Month to increase public awareness of the causes, signs and coping strategies for stress. Isaac's brain costume was made by Simon Pay of Heath Mount School and was designed to represent how a quarter of the population are living with a mental health crisis.

Isaac says: "I was so lucky with the support on the day during the London Marathon, all I could hear for 26 miles was GO BRAIN MAN GO! The support was incredible and a huge thank you to everyone who cheered me on to get to the finish. I hope my run will encourage others to get outside and run too, to release stress and feel better about themselves."

Isaac said: "Running in the costume was quite uncomfortable both physically and mentally as the costume became very heavy due to the rain with the strong winds also making my body react like a paper aeroplane. This is a representation of the difficulties many face on a day-to-day basis with poor mental health."

The solution is for everyone to understand the mental health problem and start to address it, but the reality is that there aren't nearly enough resources being allocated to this issue for us to fully understand it. A better understanding of how to help mental health could transform the lives of millions of people."

Admiral Byng - Coward, Shirker or Scapegoat? -Part One

Most readers will know the pub in Darkes Lane, and many that John Byng was the only British Admiral to have been shot by firing squad. But is there more to the tale?

Naval battles in the mid 1700s were governed by 'Fighting Instructions', which were very complicated and likened to the Quadrille, a very difficult dance. Cynics said they made battles no more dangerous than the dance. In 1744 at the Battle of Toulon, Admiral Matthews signalled his ships to form a line, as per the rules, but his deputy Lestock failed to comply. Matthews boldly attacked anyway with just six ships, but without success. Both were court martialled. Lestock, who did not want to fight, was acquitted, but Matthews was dismissed from the Navy for not following the rules. And on the panel was John Byng.

In 1756 the French invaded Minorca with 15,000 men. Byng was told to raise a fleet to combat them, but ships were missing, or old and in bad repair, and crews were short of hundreds of men: a force attacking a French merchant convoy was a higher priority. The Marines, important for boarding actions, were also taken away, but would be replaced by 700 soldiers when he reached Gibraltar. His orders were vague and contradictory.

On reaching Gibraltar, the Governor told him that the soldiers would be staying there. There were almost no stores available, and the dockyard was a wreck, useless for repairs. The only good news was that a handful of British ships had escaped Minorca and were able to reinforce him.

On 19th May, he spotted the French fleet. They were almost fresh out of harbour, with paint gleaming. More importantly, they were fully manned, and their guns were heavier. Byng's flagship, built 92 years earlier, carried only 32 and 9 pound cannon; the French flagship 52 and 24 pounders.

Would he be able to defeat the French and recapture the island? The dice were certainly loaded against him.

Ecology in action at Cranborne School

The community at Cranborne Primary school has been busy over the last 6 months renovating the school's pond and nature area. The school's Eco Committee of peer-elected children ages 5–11 years produced a plan to reinstate the neglected pond and enhance their outdoor learning environment while supporting the natural world.

Initially, they gained access to the pond area and carried out the first of many litter picks. The area needed a lot of TLC, so we invited in the Herts Wildlife Trust to help support our understanding of the wildlife we had living on the grounds and plan what we should do to adapt the area for our use whilst ensuring that we retained the integrity of the wild habitats.

The first event held was 'Cranborne's Big Dig' where volunteers from both the school and the wider community came together to prune, dig, trim, wade and generally get stuck in. A local resident, Mrs Lisa Worrell, provided homemade snacks and drinks to help keep the workers energised.

Our next community event 'Cranborne's Big Build' also involved help from our local area, building our wonderful dead hedge and installing our new secure gate and fencing. A wonderful local business, Balance Café, provided our volunteers with a tasty snack to keep morale up, as it was quite chilly! We are so grateful for all the amazing support we have received so far on our journey to provide the very best outdoor learning environment for our children.

We have received donations from our local Labour councillor, Christian Gray, Wickes builders' merchants, Lawson's builders' merchants, Beacon Clothing Solutions and Elm Court. We were lucky to have Antony Henn, owner of 'Garden on a Roll', donate a fabulous wildflower meadow and 4 native trees to further enhance our nature area. Hertsmere Community Liaison Officer for Potters Bar

Antonia Mori was recently appointed as Community Liaison Officer at Hertsmere Borough Council and shares with us her thoughts on what this role entails.

There is no typical day for a Community Engagement Officer, with a varied workload, ranging from meeting community groups, coordinating meetings amongst different organisations, supporting projects with funding applications, supporting residents with access to services, spreading positive community messaging and supporting local workshops, events, and activities.

One of the more challenging parts of the role is to reach our underserved residents and ensure that they have access to vital services that the council and local organisations provide. We have helped residents experiencing isolation and mental health problems and those affected by the cost of living. Many of the local churches and venues provide such facilities where everyone is welcome for a chat, some refreshments, or simply to sit quietly. I have spent time supporting local groups and creating lasting relationships with group leaders linking them with other local services such as Healthy Hubs, dementia services and a range of physical activity providers. Friends have been made, fun had, and many have gone away feeling far less isolated in the community.

We have also reached residents including those with disabilities by supporting local Day Centres, linking them up with other local community groups to initiate new and restart old projects. An example of this is the CAMEO (Come and Meet Each Other) group established in collaboration with The Islamic Cultural Society at the Wayside Centre. (Editor's note — see page 23 of this issue).


New exhibition at **Potters Bar Museum**




