Admiral Byng: Coward, Shirker, or Scapegoat? Part Three

Most readers will know the pub in Darkes Lane, and many that John Byng was the only British Admiral to have been shot by firing squad. But is there more to the tale?

So far, I have described how John Byng was sent in his 92 year old flagship, with an aged, slow, weakly armed and undermanned fleet to evict French invaders from Minorca. On 20th May 1756 he engaged a larger French fleet, and forced them to flee, though his ships were too badly damaged to give chase. Before the battle Byng was already short of 500 men. He had now lost another 671 killed, wounded or sick. Ships were severely damaged – Intrepid so badly that it had to be towed. He realised that the French might attack Gibraltar, so returned to defend the base if necessary.

Back in the UK, the Duke of Newcastle (Prime Minister) and Anson (Head of the Admiralty) heard on Monday 31st May that Fowke, the General at Gibraltar, had failed to give Byng troops as ordered. Enraged, on Tuesday they sacked him. On Wednesday, they received news of the French Admiral's report. Unsurprisingly, he put his own spin on the battle, alleging that the British had used their wind advantage to stay out of cannon range, and that his ships had "suffered very little". He claimed to have defeated a superior enemy – in fact, his fleet was superior, and he had fled the battle. The King was horrified, and it was decided to sack Byng.

Based solely on the French version of events, news spread rapidly. Everywhere from coffee shops to the House of Lords, there was condemnation of the British performance. Byng was a convenient target and deflected attention from failures of those in power.

On 23rd June, Byng's report finally reached London. He said that he had sailed from Gibraltar "without any visible means of being of service to Minorca when we arrived there". Most importantly, he had beaten the French, who fled the battle. This would be embarrassing to Newcastle and Anson, so it was heavily censored. Everything good for Byng or bad for the Government or Admiralty, such as lack of men or stores, was deleted. For example, "Making the best way to cover Gibraltar" became "Making the best way to Gibraltar".

Malicious and totally false gossip was fed to the newspapers, and to further discredit Byng it was announced that he would be arrested immediately he arrived back in England. In Birmingham Market Place an effigy of Byng was burned, and a mob attacked his estate at Wrotham Park, near Potters Bar.

On 28th December, Byng's court martial began in Portsmouth. Would he get a fair trial? The fact that Anson had sent three of his favourite admirals, each relying on him for future promotions, to sit as senior members of the court, may give us some idea.

The Dame Alice Owens' Eco Committee is proud to have been awarded a Green Flag, a prestigious internationally recognised award that highlights our ability to deliver innovative sustainability work within our school.

Students have been working to increase biodiversity, reduce waste and implement a sustainable travel plan to school. We were able to plant 29 trees on the school grounds which were watered weekly by our younger students. This helped us form friendships whilst helping biodiversity blossom.

Inspired by this, students carried out a survey of species on the school site, taking photographs for a photography competition. Based on these results, we have been able to nurture species on site that have been identified as endangered. We have designated areas to leave fallow to keep ecosystems flourishing. 

Cranborne Primary School were delighted to receive a letter this month from the Minister for Schools, Damian Hinds, congratulating them on their outstanding achievement in the 2023 Phonics Screening Check. 97% of children in Year 1 met the expected standard, putting Cranborne in the top 3% of all primary schools in the country!

The letter highlights the importance of this achievement: "Your particular success in teaching phonics and early reading so effectively means your pupils are developing a firm foundation, from which they can become increasingly fluent and develop a love of reading" Damian Hinds, Minister for Schools.


Phonics is a way of teaching children how to read and write. It helps children hear, identify and use different sounds that distinguish one



word from another in the English language. The phonics screening check is taken by all children in England at the end of Year 1. It is designed to give teachers and parents information on how children are progressing in phonics.

The teachers at Cranborne work very hard to ensure children have a secure grasp of phonic knowledge and use lots of different ways of supporting children and making phonics fun! Little Heath's own triumphal arch

Perbaps the most distinctive and dramatic local landmark is the Folly Arch in Little Heath. It is now the only building which remains of a much larger Gobion's Estate, the history of which can be traced back almost 900 years when Sir Richard Gobion was 'The Lord thereof in the reign of King Stephen'.

It changed hands many times before being bought by Jeremy Sambrooke in 1707, whose family accumulated their wealth from their connection with the East India Company. By the time he died in 1754, he had developed a magnificent estate, including a 15 bedroomed mansion and extensive gardens modelled by Charles Bridgeman, who was also responsible for gardens at Blenheim and Stowe.

Whilst not included in Bridgeman's original plans, in 1740 Jeremy erected what is now known as the Folly Arch. It was built as a 'Triumphal Arch' to commemorate the estate's earlier connection with Queen Elizabeth I, who had owned it for a few years in the 1500s. At approximately 15 metres (49 feet) it is taller than a more famous triumphal arch, Marble Arch. It was not originally intended as a gateway, but in 1838 owner Robert Gaussen demolished the mansion, and combined the estate with his own at Brookmans, a total of over 2,000 acres. He then created a new driveway along an avenue of lime trees, with the Arch as the entrance. The trees were removed in WW2 as part of the '*Dig for Victory'* campaign to grow as much food as possible.

Today, only the arch and the lake remain of the estate, but a lovely



view along the line of the driveway has been opened up from what is now known as Gobion's Wood. It is not physically possible to get inside the Arch, but every year large numbers of visitors come to view this remarkable piece of architecture. It is privately owned, and I would like to thank owner Anastasia Nicholas (who was also the architect for the lodge close by) for her help in preparing this article.




