Hertsmere 50th Anniversary



Community groups and voluntary organisations are encouraged to apply for funding to help celebrate Hertsmere's 50-year anniversary during 2024.

Organisations can apply for small grants up to £750 to support community events, small capital projects and organisation equipment, to mark Hertsmere's anniversary.

Among the events that could be funded through this grant are community events celebrating Hertsmere and its communities; or parties for your organisations members. You could also choose to purchase small capital items, such as a bench or equipment that would have a lasting impact on the local community.

Waste and recycling in Hertsmere



Hertsmere's new Garden Waste Collection Service will be free for the first year. You still need to sign up to the Garden Waste Collection Service to have your green bin collected from April 2024. Charges to garden waste collections will start in April 2025 and coincide with our new weekly food waste collection.

Signing up this year will not automatically commit you to an ongoing subscription. We will let you know in good time of any charges prior to the new subscription year starting.
