History Lesson for Stormont School

He escaped Germany in 1939, via the Kinder Transport, at the mere age of 8 years old.

Diyara W (aged 10) wrote "I've learnt a lot that I never knew and it was very emotional. We were touched and couldn't believe what Bernd had been through." Bernd would like us all to remember that we can all make a difference and create a better world through small acts of kindness towards each person who comes into our lives.

These visits had been arranged on the back of a History Competition in the Autumn Term that the girls were invited to enter. There was a huge response and it was difficult to choose an outright winner but Esha G in Year 4 won the competition. Her entry was about Anne Frank and she had carried out a lot of research about Anne's life, and the quality of her presentation was outstanding.

As part of the girls' history curriculum across the school, we will be marking the 75th anniversary of VE day with more themed events later in the year.

Many primary school pupils represented their schools for the first-time last November, in a fiercely competitive athletics tournament, which was eventually won by Little Heath.

Kids from four different primary schools (Little Heath, Oakmere, St Giles and Wroxham) met at Dame Alice Owen's for the annual athletics tournament.

The Wicked Lady of Hertfordshire

One of the most notorious highway robbers in Hertfordshire was a woman known as the Wicked Lady. She was the daughter of Sir Knighton Ferrers of Markyate Cell, born in 1634 and christened Katherine.

She had a sad, short life after losing both parents whilst quite young, possibly about 14 years old, when she was made a ward of the Fanshaw family. At approximately 16 years of age she married young Thomas Fanshaw, who immediately took control of her estates, losing no time in gambling away the proceeds. Thomas also spent a lot of time away fighting in the Civil War on the side of King Charles.

Young Katherine was bored and quite poor. Around this time she became involved with farmer Ralph Chaplin who introduced her to the excitement of Highway Robbery. One night Ralph attempted to rob a wagon on the notorious Finchley Common but the driver was armed and he shot Chaplin dead. Katherine was heartbroken at losing her lover and became obsessed with revenge. She plied her trade along the Hertfordshire section of Watling Street and also Nomansland Common near Wheathamstead. Many victims were unaware they were being attacked by a woman, such was her style of dress, demeanour and posture she looked every inch a strong young man. Her passion was

jewels and it is said her eyes flashed and nostrils flared as she relieved her victims of their wealth. Eventually the inevitable happened and one night whilst attempting a robbery she was shot through the shoulder. Bleeding profusely, she galloped back to her home at Markyate. She collapsed and died at the foot of the stairs that led to a secret room where she kept the clothes she wore for the robberies.

Her body was found the next morning by one of her servants who had no idea of her escapades. The year was 1659 and she was aged just twenty five. Her husband disposed of her clothes and the contents of the secret room. Mysteriously none of the treasures were ever found, although there are rumours that they were buried on Nomansland Common or in the grounds of Markyate Cell.

A poet wrote: 'Near the Cell there is a well

Near the well there is a tree Under the tree the treasure be.'

The treasure is still waiting to be found.

For Elias, football was the love of his life. He had the talent and hoped to be a professional footballer, but he didn't have the encouragement and support to carry it through.

Elias worked in his father's rag trade business manufacturing women's fashion items but found it very stressful. After three years he left, and a friend persuaded him to take a course in hairdressing. He enrolled at a private college in London where he first learnt ladies' hairdressing followed by men's, and nineteen years ago he opened his barber shop in Potters Bar.

The shop isn't a traditional barber's as Elias will also do hair colouring and modern styles for both men and women. About 10% of his clients are women. As fashions and styles change, he keeps up to date by following them on YouTube and reproducing them.

What Elias likes best about his job is the contact with his clients, and he finds communication comes naturally to him. Warmth and approachability are all important. But he finds being a boss brings great responsibility in seeking ways to improve the business, both for his clients and staff, as well as himself. He sees Potters Bar as having three main business thoroughfares: Darkes Lane and High Street, with Tesco in between, and people tend to shop in just one or two of those areas. The task is to invite and encourage more people from all the areas into his shop. Despite these worries, though, Elias thinks Potters Bar is a good town; he loves his work and is happy with life.

Boxing Day, 1962. We're on our way back home to Belsize Park from my cousin's birthday party. I drove my parents mad, blowing on a little plastic trumpet as I sat in the back of my dad's Austin A40. Turquoise green with a black roof. Very hip. I was 5 years old.

It was snowing heavily, and we'd had to leave early because tomorrow we were moving house — to some place called Potters Bar. I'd never heard of it. I was to go to a new school, called Oakmere Infants, with Mr Rice as headmaster. It was very modern, only 7 years old and much nicer than my old school in Hampstead. What a funny name — what was a mere and why did it have an oak in it?

I tooted away on my trumpet, watched the snow coming down, and recall my parents wondering how the removal van was going to cope with something called Stagg Hill. My goodness the snow was thick! Up Haverstock Hill we went until we reached the Whitestone Pond and Jack Straws Castle where dad and I used to skate on the ice. I would miss that. Down Bishops Avenue onwards, ever onwards, to this funny place called Potters Bar.

Dad skilfully manoeuvred the A40 down Carpenter's Way only to find the removal van stuck at the bottom with all our furniture in it. Eventually, with bits of old carpets under the wheels, we slowly eased our way up Tempest Avenue. The final bit of that corner into Mandeville Road was particularly difficult and mum and I had to get out of the car and walk to our new home.

The lorry was unpacked and off it went back to Hampstead and we were 'in'. Little did we know what awaited us in that freezing winter of 1962/63, but my dad said he was now "making his way" and we owned our own house. The Browns had arrived.



St Mary's Church pulls out all the stops with New Pipe Organ

Attendees at services and concerts at St Mary's Church in The Walk are enjoying the majestic sounds of a new pipe organ which became operational just before Christmas. The original organ, built in 1885 for the old St John the Baptist Church (situated where the War Memorial in the High Street now stands), was moved to St Mary's when the new church was built in 1915. The intervening years had taken their toll and by 2000 the organ was in need of major repair. After over 15 years of fundraising a redundant organ from a church in Derby fortuitously became available.

The new organ, installed by Nottingham-based organ builders Henry Groves & Son, consists of 2,250 pipes, spread across 49 stops playable on three keyboards and a pedalboard. The shortest pipe is three inches long and the longest is 18 feet.

Vicar Fr Stefan Chrysostomou says "From the very beginning, music has been a key part of Christian worship. We are called to offer our



very best in praising God, and our new organ will help us do just that. Not only will it enhance our services at St Mary's, it will also contribute to enriching the musical life of our town and wider community through concerts and other events."

The church has taken expert advice from Mr Paul Hale, Southwell Minster Organist Emeritus and Mr Andrew Lucas, Master of the Music at St Albans Abbey. Paul will be playing the inaugural Gala Recital on Saturday

14th March 2020 at 7.30pm. Tickets £12 available on the door, tickets@stmaryspb.org.uk or online via www.stmaryspb.org.uk/organRecital.html — under 15s free.


