Queen's Scouts Awards

Adventurer Bear Grylls awarded Hertfordshire Scouts the highest honour in Scouting at Windsor Castle in the

The 15 local Scouts were among nearly 500 new recipients of the Queen's Scouts Award on Sunday 26th April 2015. As well as Chief Scout Grylls, they were joined by Birgitte, Duchess of Gloucester GCVO, cousin of HM the Oueen.



The award for outstanding personal achievement is given to those aged between 16 and 25 who have completed a range of challenges including service to their community, completing an expedition in wild country, undertaking a five-day residential project in an unfamiliar environment and learning a new skill or developing an existing talent.

"All these young people have lived the adventure of a lifetime to achieve their Queen's Scout Awards, and I admire that spirit so much," Grylls said.

"They are huge inspirations to the other 550,000 scouts in the UK and I am so pleased that scouting has honoured them today. They are amazing." Local scouts honoured were Jay and Nicole Pendrell-Smith, Oliver Middleton, James Sanderson, Alex Brunning and Paul Scott.

Paul 23, from Potters Bar, commented: "Working towards my Queen's Scout Award has enabled me to make a positive impact in my local community. Completing it has been a massive highlight in my life by being able to learn new skills, develop friendships and working in my local community. I am proud to have put so much effort in as I can already see the benefits. I hope to pass on what I have learnt to other members of Hertfordshire Scouts."

The annual event has been held regularly since 1934 on the Sunday nearest to St George's Day, St George being the Patron Saint of Scouting. Over 100,000 Queen's Scout Awards have been presented to young men and women since its instigation.

Writer and television presenter Grylls, who became the youngest ever Chief Scout when he was appointed aged 35, is famed for his wilderness survival expertise. Among the challenges taken on by Queen's Scout Award recipients are a four-day, three-night expedition in open or adventurous country by foot, cycle, horse, canoe, boat or dinghy. The scouts must show their skills in preparation, training, teamwork and leadership.

Last year, scouts were involved in a diverse range of projects including collecting goods for food banks, creating and cleaning up play spaces for young people with learning difficulties, spending time with those suffering from dementia, helping to support and promote the health of Britain's waterways as Junior River Stewards, and creating wildflower meadows.

Scouting has now announced a revamp of its activity programme and launched 165 new and updated badges including a Disability Awareness badge and new Navigator and Camp Craft badges. They complement the Scout Association's Strategic Plan for 2018 which maintains a focus on growth, inclusivity, youth and community impact. The changes reflect the changing demands and interests of today's young people who have particularly asked for leadership and teamwork to be recognised.

Applying to University? A personal viewpoint

The thought of applying to university can often be a daunting experience. However the process really isn't as stressful as you may think. It requires a lot of thought, especially in regards to the numerous courses available to you. When choosing the ideal course it is important to consider what career you wish to have in the future and what sort of qualifications you would need. For me, choosing what I wanted to study was extremely difficult. So for a while I pondered on what career would successfully raise a possible family of four in my years to come, until of course I got a reality check and figured I would enjoy and benefit a lot more if I chose a course that I was confident in. My initial advice is therefore not to get too distracted in thinking about your future financial position, but rather spend the time thinking about what it is you enjoy and are good at.

When it comes to picking which university choices you wish to make, it is important not to get sidetracked and pressure yourself to work towards getting into top universities such as Oxford and Cambridge. It is vital that you look at universities that you are capable of getting into, and match their entry requirements with your predicted A level grades. Although the idea of being the centre of attention at your sister's barbeque because you got into Oxford sounds appealing, it unfortunately doesn't happen to all of us! After all, a degree is a degree, the university placement should not be focused on too much. However, what you do need to consider is where you want to live for the next three years, and that is why I would highly recommend visiting any campuses that you may have an interest in. This will essentially allow you to have a feel for the social and environmental side to university life and whether this would suit your needs.

Then comes the dreaded personal statement. Personally, I found writing 4000 characters about my strengths and overall qualities to be quite a challenge, and it certainly isn't something that you'll master first time. Personal statements need a lot of editing before they can be submitted, to ensure you're presented as an ideal student. However, once you have picked a course you wish to study, writing your personal statement will come naturally.

It is fair to say that the 13th August 2015 will be a very tense one, not only for students, but also parents and teachers, as results day can be a very intense experience. Will you get the grades? Won't you? If not, and you don't get into the university you originally applied for, you can apply for something provided by UCAS, known as clearing. This is where students who haven't received their expected grades go in order to apply to other universities that have extra spaces and can offer a place to those who were unsuccessful in their firm choices. So don't panic, it's not the end of the world. If you are planning on going to university in the near future, or expecting A level results, I wish you all the best of luck, and remember the beautiful thing about education is that nobody can take it away from you.

We also went on some crazy bumper cars on ice! Very unusual, I don't think I will ever get a chance to do something like that again. On the final evening we went to the local bowling alley. It was such a great evening. There were even prizes for the winners of bowling!

Overall, everyone thoroughly enjoyed the trip. Many of the

Orienteering Terms

This time we take a look at the would-be Olympic sport of Orienteering.

Badge: emblem/awarded for achievement of particular standards.

Bearing: machine part/direction indication using a compass.

BOC: British Oxygen Company/British Orienteering Championships.

Brikke: misspelt wall constituent/electronic gizmo carried by competitor.

Checkpoint: Charlie perhaps/a control point which has to be reached.

Classic: cars for example/a long distance event.

Circle: underground line/used to indicate a control point on the map.

Colour coded: as in a plug maybe/indicates length and difficulty of course. Ranging from white(easiest) to black(hardest).

Community orienteering: *Community News* delivery!/training events to promote skill development.

Crossing point: a bridge maybe/indicates a place, sometimes compulsory, where an obstacle should be crossed. Designed to protect walls and fences.

Dibber: for planting/as Brikke, above. On finishing, this enables a computer print-out of the results to be produced showing times at the control points.

Flag: weaken/white or orange, marking each control point.

Kite: some are red/same as flag.

Punch: left hook maybe/a punch card system originally used to record reaching a control.

Punching: boxing/the action of proof in reaching the control.

Electric punch: Game Boy boxing/electronic evidence to prove you have reached a control.

Splits: uncomfortable leg position/time taken between controls.

String Course: a type of vest perhaps/a short course for children, marked out by a continuous line of string.

Sprint: run very fast/short distance event, normally in a town or park.

Night orienteering: confused walk home from pub/orienteering in the dark, with a headtorch.

The Women's Institute

The most famous women's organisation in Britain celebrates its 100th anniversary in 2015.

Did you know that there are two Women's Institutes (WI) in Potters Bar? The Furzefield and Oakmere groups both meet monthly in Tilbury Hall, Darkes Lane. Hertfordshire boasts 94 WIs, all under the umbrella of the Hertfordshire Federation of Women's Institutes (HFWI).

A Brief History of the WI

The Women's Institute is stereotyped as a quintessentially British affair, exclusively for ladies of advanced years, with "Jam and Jerusalem" as the focal point.

In fact, the WI hails from Canada and has seen a steady rise in younger members in recent years. It was formed in 1897 in Stoney Creek, Ontario as a branch of the Farmers Institute. Inspired by a talk given by Adelaide Hoodless, farmers' wives arranged meetings in their homes to exchange ideas on improving conditions of rural life. In this small way a great movement was born.

The movement came to Britain with WI member Margaret "Madge" Watt, who crossed the pond in 1913. She helped form the first WI outside Canada in Anglesey, North Wales, on 16th September 1915.

In the throes of the First World War the needs of the country were specific, and the WI's aim was to reinvigorate rural communities and involve women

in food production. Later, the focus shifted to encouraging women to broaden their skills, become active in their communities and campaign on local issues.

The introduction of an Executive Committee, rules and the formation of the National Federation of Women's Institutes (NFWI) brought more official status. Lady Gertrude Denman, an active campaigner for women's suffrage, became its first President in 1917.

Hertfordshire's first WI was established the same year, in Northaw. Within a year there were 14 more WIs, leading to the formation of the HFWI in 1919.

Diverse in culture and independent from politics and the Church, by 1926 the WI had become an important part of rural life. It naturally spread into urban areas, eventually going global. It is now among the world's largest and most representative organisations for women and has nearly a quarter of a million members in England and Wales.

Despite its wartime foundation, the WI has always been reluctant to be associated with military work. During the Second World War members concentrated on safeguarding evacuees and running government-sponsored Preservation Centres, where one of the stereotypes was born: here volunteers made jam which was sent to depots to be added to the rations.

The second stereotype arrived courtesy of Sir Walford Davies, who was asked to write an arrangement of Hubert Parry's setting of Jerusalem for WI choirs. The song was first performed in 1924 at the NFWI's Annual General Meeting (AGM) in the Queen's Hall, London. It was, needless to say, a resounding success, and opens the NFWI AGMs and many WI meetings to this day.

The 1940s saw real progress in the administrative organisation of the WI. The eminent classics scholar, lecturer and broadcaster, Sir Richard Livingstone, actively supported the WI having its own premises, and Denman College, based at Marcham Park in Oxfordshire and named for the NFWI's first President, was opened in 1948. Today, the college houses en-suite rooms decorated and furnished by individual federations, is home to the WI Cookery School, and offers over 600 courses to both members and non-members

The first HFWI headquarters was in St Albans: initially at the National Farmers Union offices, then moving to Spencer Street in 1955. By 2009 this building had become untenable and in February 2010 the office relocated to Wheathampstead.

The Federation Shop came about almost by accident. It was necessary to retain the retail status at the front of the property; this proved to be an ideal opportunity to showcase members' handicrafts, ranging from traditional knitting to modern jewellery.

The shop is also a great showcase for publicising the organisation, and a High Street feature for locals. As well as two offices and a committee room, the new building also houses a workshop area.

Today the WI movement continues to thrive in Hertfordshire, with nearly 4000 members across the county, and younger women joining existing groups or forming new ones every year.

Panshanger Park

A local country park just a few miles away from Potters Bar — Panshanger Park is a large piece of the countryside (900 acres) between Hertford and Welwyn Garden City, just to the north of the A141. It was not available to the public for many years because in 1982 the Panshanger estate owners were granted mineral extraction rights. However the agreement obliged the owners (now Lafarge Tarmac) to restore the Country Park and a year ago the first part of the restored park was opened. The Friends of Panshanger Park are working with the company to open the rest. They are keen to publicise the park so that people can enjoy it for walking and fresh air.

It is recognised by English Heritage as a landscape of national importance and Grade II listed. Two great 18th century designers Lancelot 'Capability' Brown and Humphry Repton designed the park, which includes much ancient woodland and the 600 year old Panshanger Oak, chosen in 2002 as one of Britain's 50 greatest trees. Although the original house has been demolished some estate buildings, including the Orangery and the gardens, could be restored in future. There are several car parks around the park, including the main one in Thieves Lane, just off the A141 to the west of Heriford. For further information and to join the Friends for free see



Buildings of Interest

This is the fifth of a series of articles about buildings of interest in Potters Bar.



Church Road

There is a row of six houses in Church Road standing opposite the triangular piece of land between Church Road and Osborne Road which, in terms of architecture, may be described as typical of late 19th Century terraced housing.

The building comprises two-storey terraced houses made of brick, rendered and painted white with a gabled slate roof and two chimney stacks. It is thought to date from around 1890 and is a good example of surviving late 19th Century workers cottages in Potters Bar. Four of the properties retain their original sash windows with segmental headed openings and projecting sills.

The triangle of land opposite was the site of St Michaels and all Angels Mission Church. A corrugated iron building, it seated 160 but was burned down c. 1942 and not replaced. It formed part of the early settlement of Little Heath. This Church was erected in 1874 at the sole cost of Mr Watkins, Vicar of St. John's Church, now demolished, which was situated where the War Memorial now stands.

What a Woman!

You probably know the name. Caroline Presho is an active Potters Bar resident and she has quite a story. She has a burgeoning media profile in the UK and her work spans the globe. A seat on the *Good Morning Britain* sofa is nothing out of the ordinary, and being contacted by BBC 5 Live whilst doing the school run is something she takes in her stride.

Caroline is a carrier of a BRCA gene mutation. BRCA1 and BRCA2 are human genes that produce tumour suppressor proteins. These proteins help repair damaged DNA and, therefore, play a role in ensuring the stability of the cell's genetic material. When either of these genes is mutated, or altered, DNA damage may not be repaired properly. As a result, cells are more likely to develop additional genetic alterations that can lead to cancer. Specific inherited mutations in BRCA1 and BRCA2 increase the risk of breast and ovarian cancers in women, and they have been associated with increased risks of several additional types of cancer such as male breast cancer, prostate cancer, pancreatic cancer and melanoma. A harmful BRCA1 or BRCA2 mutation can be inherited from a person's mother or father. Each child of a parent who carries a mutation in one of these genes has a 50% chance (or 1 chance in 2) of inheriting the mutation.

Caroline runs a support group called BRCA Umbrella. This is a forum where members can post questions and blog posts in relation to the BRCA gene. Caroline has been running this support group since 2011 and she believes it creates a genuine space where views can be exchanged and support can be offered. It certainly provided support for her when she most needed it. The website can be visited at www.brcaumbrella.ning.com.Caroline recognises that she has created a monster. The forum now has over 2,000 members, from Potters Bar to Montreal to Israel!

Caroline acknowledges that facing up to the challenges of a BRCA gene mutation can be extraordinarily difficult. She knows. She has four young children who may also inherit the genetic mutation. What inspired Caroline was the ability of human beings to create a space and dialogue where multiple experiences can be shared. This has been helped not least by the growing media attention given to the BRCA gene in light of the personal circumstances of Angelina Jolie. Caroline believes that only with growing recognition and openness can the collective mindset be focussed on wavs in which we handle BRCA gene mutations.


