# **Admiral Byng: Coward,** shirker, or scapegoat?

### **Part four**

Most readers will know the pub in Darkes Lane, and many that John Byng was the only British Admiral to have been shot by firing squad. But is there more to the tale?

So far, I have described how John Byng was sent in his 92-year-old flagship, with an aged, slow, weakly armed, and undermanned fleet to evict French invaders from Minorca. He engaged a larger French fleet, and forced them to flee, though his ships were too badly damaged to give chase. Based on French claims of victory, a misinformation campaign was run against him before he returned to the UK, and he was arrested on his return. His court martial panel was led by three admirals who were dependent on Anson, the First Lord of the Admiralty, who was behind the decision to set up the hearing.

Byng was charged with "Failing to do his utmost on 20th May 1756..." At the time, there was only one penalty permitted – death.

The trial began on 28th December. Despite the charge relating only to one day, the first decision of the court was to look at all events after he left Portsmouth. The first witness was his deputy, who said he was dissatisfied, but did not know the cause – implying he thought Byng guilty but was too loyal to say. Under cross examination he said the fleet was in very poor condition, but the court rejected this and all other criticisms of the Admiralty. Many witnesses contradicted themselves one said Byng failed to engage, although he did see his ship firing at the enemy.

The trial ended on 19th January, with the verdict on 27th. Byng was confident he would be acquitted, and shocked that he was not. Members of the court unanimously recommended that the King should reprieve the death sentence. Again, the reasons for the verdict were contradictory: one paragraph said he steered correctly, another said he should have steered directly at the enemy.

To prove the charge, there had to be "Cowardice, dissatisfaction or negligence". The verdict specifically ruled out the first two, and merely said there was an error of judgement. This is not the same as negligence.

There were numerous appeals to the King, but he thought Byng was a coward and wanted to make an example of him, so as not to upset 'The City' as he wanted their money. Byng stayed calm and accepted his fate. Two days before his death, he made a will, leaving Wrotham Park, near Potters Bar, to his brother's older son George. Many visitors came the next day. On 14th March, he was shot aboard HMS Monarch.

So, was he a coward? No. Was he a shirker? No. Was he a scapegoat for the failings of others, and a victim of a terrible miscarriage of justice? Most definitely.



## The Royal Veterinary College launches birthday appeal



The Royal Veterinary College (RVC) is celebrating 20 years of its life-saving blood donation programme To mark the special occasion and provide more cats and dogs with this vital service, the RVC's charity, The Animal Care Trust (ACT), has

# *launched an appeal to raise £150,000 towards new facilities and is calling on local residents for support.*

The RVC is the only veterinary hospital in the UK with a dedicated transfusion medicine service. It is also the only organisation in the UK that stores feline blood products.

Since the first donor cohort of just 19 dogs twenty years ago, the programme now benefits from 150 dogs and 62 cats who regularly donate their blood to others being treated at the RVC's Small Animal Referral Hospital based at the North Mymms Hawkshead campus. Like humans, sick cats and dogs sometimes require blood transfusions. As well as organising a reliable supply of blood products to the hospital, the RVC has also pioneered the development of transfusion medicine in cats and dogs conducting research into the welfare of donors, how to store cat blood and amazingly, using dog blood to help cats.

With the service expanding over the years, the demand for cat and dog blood continues to grow and ACT is seeking to improve the experience for donors creating separate dedicated areas for dogs and cats and give the team space for their own laboratory to process and store donated blood products.

# Young people triumph

Over recent weeks, young people from across the region have been competing in Rotary Youth Competitions. Dame Alice Owens students Ava Gilbert (Intermediate) and Zahra Hamdulay (Senior) won the local beat and then went on to win the Beds, Bucks and Herts District round of the Young Writer competition, producing up to 550 words of prose or poetry on the theme of 'Rebuilding'.



Meanwhile Reuben Smith of Chancellors School was the winner of the local and District heat of the Young Photographer competition and goes forward to the national round. ## Herts Ability help John to drive again

After a severe accident on "America's Got Talent: Extreme", Jonathan Goodwin, a retired escapologist and stunt performer, regained the ability to drive with the help of Herts Ability. Goodwin, 44, from Potters Bar, was left wheelchair-bound following an accident during a stunt which involved escaping from a straitjacket suspended 30 feet in the air, leading to severe injuries after an incident involving two cars.

During his recovery, which included five months in hospital, Goodwin contacted Herts Ability in Welwyn Garden City. This centre is part of the Driving Mobility network, supported by the Department for Transport, providing assessments for drivers with disabilities to ensure safety through appropriate vehicle adaptations.

Eager to regain his independence, Goodwin self-referred for an assessment. "I had become a burden to my partner and needed to try and get back to driving as soon as possible", he explained. The assessment was thorough, combining cognitive tests and practical evaluations with adapted driving controls, which were somewhat familiar to Goodwin from his stunt work.

The assessment was a success, and Goodwin was recommended a hand-operated push-pull system for acceleration and braking, along with a steering ball. Herts Ability submitted their findings to the DVLA, and soon after, Goodwin was approved to drive an adapted vehicle. He had his Volvo modified by PB Conversions in time for Christmas.

Now driving for over a year, Goodwin has become a Patron of Herts Ability. He is dedicated to advocating for the possibility of driving with disabilities, emphasising, "The adaptation technology that exists today is extraordinary".

# Living with a stoma a patient's journey

On 15th April 2024 Nicola Marzolini, representing the Ostofriends Stoma Support Group and Nurse Breege O'Neill from the Salts Healthcare North London Community Stoma Nursing Team were invited to present at one of a series of bealth talks arranged by the Friends of Parkfield Patient Participation Group and hosted by Potters Bar United Reformed Church.

The purpose of the presentation was to raise awareness of stomas, share information on the need for a stoma, appliances, potential issues, as well as the role of the Community Stoma Nursing Team. Nicola's personal experience was explained and there was an

introduction to Ostofriends, highlighting the benefits of being part of a group whose focus is to provide a supportive network to individuals in the local community living with a stoma.

Ostofriends is a group of volunteers from Potters Bar and the surrounding areas, and it includes members from as far as Hemel Hempstead



to Kentish Town. The group was founded in 2018 by six stoma patients and has a current membership of 39. The core values of Ostofriends are inclusivity, respectfulness, empathy and understanding, reassurance/resilience and awareness.

# How is your *Community News* produced?

Articles of general local interest are sent to us for consideration throughout the year and we are always on the lookout out for more. Our deadline for copy is one month prior to the intended publication date and a timely reminder is issued to local clubs and charities.

Articles are edited as necessary – we ask that they are limited to 300 words, although we do have the facility to include longer items on our website. The articles are mapped out onto our normal 28 pages and sent to Carey, our Graphic Designer, together with the updated *Local Organisations* directory and *'What's On'*. Carey somehow manages to make sense of the basic outline sent to her and the copy is then ready for proofing. In the meantime, Debbie Usher has been finalising the relevant advertising material and this is then added in consultation with Carey.

When the issue has been finalised, a copy is available to view on our website and we notify several local Facebook groups accordingly. We are then ready for the print run of 13,500 copies where the expertise of Gary Usher comes to the fore, with the quality of the production presenting such a professional image.

We then have the logistical exercise of getting them to you. They are produced in boxes of 100 and the initial stage involves Gary delivering the appropriate number of boxes to our volunteer wholesale distributors, who handle, on average, 10 boxes each. Their job is then to divide these into the required number for the individual deliveries for each road and get them to the person who puts them through your letter box.

Altogether, we have well over 100 people involved in our deliveries., with Peter Weaver directing operations. This whole exercise can sometimes take a while – everyone involved is a volunteer – and we can only expect them to be delivered when it is convenient to them. So, please bear with us, particularly in this, the holiday season.

## Challenge - To run 5k every day for a year

Jimmy Lloyd is no ordinary 47-year-old businessman – be's made a pledge to run 5k-a-day to belp the children and families who receive support from Noah's Ark Children's Hospice. Jimmy lives with his fiancée Gemma and their four children. He enjoys boxing and football but most of his time these days is spent running.



The journey to becoming a running superstar began in 2020 for Jimmy, when Gemma's sister Hollie was diagnosed with glioblastoma, an aggressive type of brain cancer. After experiencing the devastation of

Hollie's sudden illness, and subsequent death, Jimmy started thinking about mortality.

The desire to do something positive coincided with Jimmy picking up a copy of Rob Delaney's book '*A Heart That Works*'. Jimmy describes the book as being 'Powerful, bizarrely uplifting in parts and horrifyingly sad in others.' The book details the support that Rob's son Henry received from Noah's Ark Children's Hospice at the end of his life. Jimmy recognised that Noah's Ark Children's Hospice is something very special and wanted to help in their mission to help children with life-limiting and life-threatening conditions make the most of everyday.

As a runner already, Jimmy decided he wanted to do something reflective of the situation facing most of the children and families that receive children's hospice support. To get up every day, and face the same thing, again and again, and so the 5k-a-day challenge was born. Jimmy has a well-trodden route around Bristol but has also completed his miles in Chicago, New York, and The Cotswolds.

The road hasn't always been smooth, Jimmy caught a virus and had to do his miles on a treadmill but, six months in, Jimmy is determined to complete the challenge and raise £10k for Noah's Ark! # Follow the Greek Gods in playing croquet!

There are some interesting unofficial theories about the origins of croquet, from it being a game that was enjoyed by the Greek Gods to one that French peasants played in the 14th Century, when they fashioned hoops made from willow branches and used their shepherds' crooks as mallets. It is now believed the game came to England, via Ireland, after being invented by the French. The first rules were established by Jacques of London in 1857 and the game was included as a demonstration sport at the Paris Olympics in 1900. Today, there are two types of Croquet game, the original game of Association Croquet, and the more widely played modern game of Golf Croquet, which is quicker and simpler to play. The object of both games is to hit your ball through seven boops in sequence before your opponent.

Croquet is an ideal sport for all ages, providing exercise in the fresh air and the opportunity to make new friends. Our croquet group started in conjunction with The Barnet Bowls Club when they were looking to make use of their rarely used ladies' bowling green. The Club is now known as the Barnet Bowls and Croquet Club, and preparations are already under way for the centenary celebration in two years' time. We have had a busy start to the season here at Zenith Trampoline Club.







# The most beautiful church?

#### Of the numerous local churches, arguably the most beautiful is also one of the less well known: the Greek Orthodox Church of the Twelve Apostles in Kentish Lane, Brookmans Park.

Originally built in 1850 as the Anglican St Mark's Church, as attendances fell it was taken over in the 1960s by the Catholic Church as a Seminary for the training of monks, named The Crusade of the Holy Spirit. In 1998, it was purchased by the Greek Orthodox Church, and completely refurbished inside. All of the highly impressive ornate features, such as icons and stained glass, were donated by members of the church. Murals were painted by Father Loucas from the Monastery at Mount Athos, the world's leading Orthodox iconographer.

There is a flourishing congregation with 200 people attending regular Sunday services. There are 80 to 90 weddings each year, and at least 250 baptisms: in April 46 adults were baptised on the same day by Archbishop Nikitas. Most services are partly in Greek, but there is a service in English 9.30-10.30am each Saturday – all are welcome.

A wide variety of activities in the adjoining Church Hall include classes in Greek for adults, Byzantine chanting and there are visiting speakers. The Golden Years Club provides monthly lunches for members of the Church over 60, and organises excursions to a monastery in Essex, to other churches and to the coast. A food bank, originally started during the Covid epidemic, also operates from the Church. It is run by Stella Spyrou, who can be contacted via the Church Office.

In the autumn the Church will hold an Open Day: everyone will be welcome. The date will be published on the *Community News* website. Refreshments will be provided, and it will be an excellent opportunity to learn about the Greek Orthodox Religion. Anyone wishing to attend should contact Stella Nicolaou on **01707 650147**.




