Multiple anniversaries at the de Havilland Aircraft Museum

Opened 65 years ago in 1959, the de Havilland Aircraft Museum is Britain's oldest aviation centre; 15 years later in 1974, the supporters' society was established. These volunteers enabled the museum to build modern bangars, acquire additional exhibits and open six days a week. Today, over 200 supporters maintain its 22 aircraft and all aspects of the site, finance, and IT. The Museum were bonoured to have



Annie Brewster. High Sherriff of Hertfordshire officiate at the golden anniversary of the supporters' society.

2024 is a significant year for three of the exhibits. 20th October marks the 90th anniversary of the MacRobertson Air Race from England to

Melbourne in Australia. It was won by a twin engine dH88 Comet; the Museum's replica features considerable material about the aircraft and the race. September is the 80th anniversary of the ill-fated

Operation Market Garden. The Horsa Glider was widely used to deliver troops to the Arnhem Bridge. Our exhibit has seen

significant renovation recently, ready for the commemoration from 22nd September onwards.

Finally, this year is the 75th anniversary of the maiden flight of the Comet, the world's first commercial jet airliner. The museum has a fully restored fuselage and cockpit in Air France livery.

Open every day, except Mondays, from 10.30am, the museum has plenty to offer to enthusiasts, families, and special interest groups. Find out more by visiting our website, www.dehavillandmuseum.co.uk.



Local author's popular latest book: "Rivals Of The Beatles 2"!

Brookmans Park resident Martin Orkin's second book about The Beatles and 1960s pop music, "Rivals Of The Beatles 2", bas been proving as popular with readers as was bis first volume. Martin again discusses other groups who competed with The Beatles, or whom they inspired: great acts like The Animals, Simon & Garfunkel, The Who and Queen. Here, 60 years on from the release of their overlooked and unloved first album, is an interesting piece drawn from Martin's chapter on the wonderful Simon & Garfunkel!

When Simon & Garfunkel's first folk music-based LP, Wednesday Morning 3AM, was released in America in October 1964, it was a complete flop. Almost nobody bought it. Only the following year did anything happen for the record. That was when one particular track from it began getting requested on US radio stations. But the album itself still wasn't selling.

Meanwhile, after seeing The Beatles' movie A Hard Day's Night, and then electrifying their sound. The Byrds had caused a sensation in America in May 1965 with their debut single. This was 'Mr Tambourine Man', which added a rock beat to folk-type music and then went to no. 1 around the world. The Byrds' record company was delighted. They decided to try the same approach again by adding bass, drums and electric guitar to that old Simon & Garfunkel LP track which was proving popular on the radio. The song, 'The Sounds Of Silence', duly became another number 1 hit, and launched Simon & Garfunkel's career. So, one could say that The Beatles were actually responsible for Simon & Garfunkel becoming famous!

Enriching outdoor environment at Ladbrooke School

Children at Ladbrooke JMI School were surprised, but very excited, to see new markings in both the infant and junior playgrounds, on returning from their summer bolidays. Playground markings bave bealth and fitness benefits, but there is also the educational element that reinforces learning through play.

Seth, our Year 6 reporter, along with the help of Mrs Romain, has spent some time getting to know the different markings in each playground and asked the children what they feel about them.

"In the junior playground, we can now see the lines of the netball court more clearly. This is much better for the netballers when they are playing. There is an activity which encourages you to jump across the line. The children enjoy seeing how far they can jump. One of the markings is a game called *'Mirror Me'*. When someone does a move, maybe a dance move, up to three others can copy that move. This is a really colourful marking and the children play on this lots. There is a bowling alley (not a real one of course) but the children are often queuing so they can have a go at bowling the ball down the lines alley.

The younger children love to play 'What's the time Mr Wolf?', and so that marking is very popular with the children. Our old Hopscotch marking has been updated and encourages the younger children to play together. The activity circuit takes up most



of the infant playground, but it is lovely to see lots of the children travelling along the lines and following the instructions.

The playground markings have been very popular with all the children across the school, and we hope that they will continue to use the playground markings for years to come."

Certainly, no bad luck on this Friday 13th!

On this particular September Friday, the annual Health and Wellbeing event took place at Wyllyotts Theatre in Potters Bar. And what a successful event! Over 600 people came through the door to interact with 26 local and national organisations, experience new health-focused activities and listen to informative talks by local doctors. It was certainly a day bringing the community together with a positive health focus.

The stalls in the main hall included The Stroke Association, Herts Ability, Bowel Cancer UK, and the Moorfields Unit at Potters Bar Hospital. Local people were able to chat to stallholders and take away information on a wide range of subjects.

In a separate room the day started with a session on Chair Yoga followed by packed sessions on Tai Chi, Mindfulness, Musical Memories, Clock Cricket, and a gentler ballet session by Silver Swans. Everyone trying something new!

Outside was the Hertfordshire Better Health Bus where visitors could have a health check including blood pressure and weight. This was in very high demand and visitors commented on how useful they had found the results. Meanwhile, inside, doctors from all three surgeries gave extremely informative talks on blood pressure, cataracts, and respiratory conditions.

Our visitors, Councillor Paul Richards and Sir Oliver Dowden MP were very impressed by the dedication and commitment of all the people involved. Thanks to Wyllyotts, all the local surgeries and a team of hardworking volunteers for helping to make the day such a success. See you again next year!

Admiral Byng's connection to Potters Bar - Wrotham Park

Over the last four editions I have described how Admiral John Byng was made a scapegoat for other people's failings and shot aboard HMS Monarch on 14th March 1757. Most will know the pub in Darkes Lane, but not everyone will know his local connection.

In the early 1750s, Byng travelled between his Berkeley Square home and his



father's in Southill, Bedfordshire. He decided to commission the architect Isaac Ware to design a country house and acquired 140 acres from Enfield Chase and the manor of South Mimms. The house, known as Wrotham Park, was originally two storeys, with single storey wings, and finished in red brick.

He planned to move in 1755–6, but his mistress Susanne Hickson fell ill, so he stayed close by her in Finchley until she sadly died. He was then sent on his ill-fated last voyage, and never lived at Wrotham Park, bequeathing it to his nephew George Byng.

In 1811–12 his son, George Byng Junior, extended the dining room and wings, and added a stable block. In 1845, he inherited &365K (&27M today) from William Wentworth, 2nd Earl of Strafford. When he died two years later, his will stipulated that this could only be used for capital expenditure on the house, not repairs.

1854 saw a new resident who added an extra floor for servant accommodation, a dairy, a laundry and completely rendered the house. In 1860 this person, George Stevens Byng, became Earl of Strafford, adding entwined letters "S" symbols to the gable ends of the wings. A major fire in 1883 necessitated a large mortgage, and it was not until the 1930s that the 6th Earl of Strafford installed electricity. A further refurbishment in 1978 included a lift.

Whilst John Byng was unhappily never able to enjoy his new home or the Potters Bar area, many generations of his family have done so, and they still reside there today.

Upgrade for **Potters Bar Town**

The planned upgrades include the installation of new dugouts, perimeter fencing and storage containers to support the operational needs of the club. Additionally, the Lantern Stadium will see the introduction of a new terraced standing area and the replacement of one of the existing stands.

The move to a 3G pitch will not only improve the playing surface for the team, but also most importantly allow for greater use of the pitch by the local community within Hertsmere, reinforcing the club's role as a central community hub in Potters Bar.

The club has worked closely with Hertsmere Borough Council and the CiL sponsors and community partners to ensure that the necessary funds are secured to bring this ambitious vision to life. The club aims to commence construction as soon as possible, with a projected completion date set within November. Until then, home matches are being played at King's Langley.

The facilities will be used by over 1,000 adults and youths per week, and plans are already in place to create and collaborate with youth teams, women's teams, and disability football clubs, who will all have access to the facilities.





Clock Cricket CIC is a not-for-profit Community Interest Company based in Hertfordshire. We deliver seated cricket sessions to the older generation, along with New Age Kurling, Giant Noughts and Crosses, and Boccia.



Clock Cricket was the brainchild of one of the Directors, Richard Hill. He began to deliver sessions in Care Homes in Hertfordshire a number of years ago. In 2019 Richard delivered a demonstration session at Glamorgan County and, as a result of this, Sean Carey began to

deliver sessions at Stroke Units in Monmouthshire.

Richard and Sean kept in touch during the pandemic and began to work again, primarily with Hertswise Dementia Support Groups in Hertfordshire. These groups loved the fun, laughter and gentle exercise associated with Clock Cricket. Word quickly began to spread, and we started to work with a number of other organisations across Hertfordshire. We also continued our work in South Wales.

In 2023 we became a Community Interest Company. This enabled us to apply for grants and additional funding. We now have a team of 7, including 3 directors, Richard, Sean and Tony Davies, and 4 facilitators in Hertfordshire and South Wales.

During 2023 we calculated that we saw approximately 4,000 people and we are on track to comfortably increase that number during 2024. Our ethos is that everyone deserves to have some fun, gentle exercise and laughter in an inclusive environment which enhances peoples' lives. A fitting tribute from a carer at a group was "you gave me my husband back for two hours." Nothing more needs to be said.


The ethos of Capital Arts, since it was founded in 1989, has been to train children to a high standard and to give its students a chance to perform with professional actors, singers, and dancers.




